Wednesday, June 21, 8:00 pm - 10:00 pm Rally staff will be available starting at 5 pm for scoring. Dinner will be served from 6 to 10pm.

Time penalty begins at 8:00:01 pm. After 8:00:00 pm there will be 20 points per minute penalty for being late. "Minutes" will be rounded up at one second past the key time. For example, 8:00:01 (one second past 8:00 pm) will be counted as 1 minute late. Any rider who arrives after 10:00:00 pm (beginning 10:00:01 pm) will not be considered a rally finisher.

If you will be late or unable to arrive at the checkpoint, call the Rallymaster immediately.
