Concrete Donut AZ-386, 12.1 road miles south of the intersection with AZ-86. Tucson area, AZ 31.9602, -111.5984 0900-1600



They might be hard on the teeth, but these concrete donuts are important when setting balance on the telescopes before the real glass is installed.

Take a photo of the painted concrete donut in the Kitt Peak observatory parking lot. Be aware that the road to the peak is closed nightly from 1600 to 0900.

The Santa Monica Pier is a place you can find fair food year-round. Consider treating yourself to a funnel cake or a scoop of ice cream to enjoy on the walk back to your bike.

Take a photo of the Pacific Park entrance structure on the Santa Monica Pier. The structure includes a large, stylized octopus. Note that you may not ride your motorcycle onto the pier. There are ample parking areas near the base of the pier or on the streets of Santa Monica. From there you must walk out onto the pier to claim this bonus.

Rally staff will be available starting at 5 pm for scoring.

Dinner will be served from 6 to 10pm.

Time penalty begins at 8:00:01 pm. After 8:00:00 pm there will be 30 points per minute penalty for being late. "Minutes" will be rounded up at one second past the key time. For example, 8:00:01 (one second past 8:00 pm) will be counted as 1 minute late. Any rider who arrives after 10:00:00 pm (beginning 10:00:01 pm) will not be considered a rally finisher.

If you will be late or unable to arrive at the checkpoint, call the Rallymaster immediately.
